<u>Swimming</u> - Students need to bring their togs **every day** as we will be utilising our school pool as part of our daily fitness and swimming programme. Whilst tamariki might not be scheduled to swim everyday there can be timetable changes and so they should be prepared to do so. Swimming Sports will be held at Marton Pool date TBC. <u>Sunsmart School</u> - As a Sunsmart School, Terms 1 and 4 are hat terms. If students do not bring a hat to school to protect themselves then there are shaded areas that they are required to be in during break times. Students should apply sunblock before school and then use the classroom supplies to top up as needed. We ask that you speak to your children about doing this regularly and responsibly.



<u>Camp</u> - Camp for Tūrangawaewae will be taking place at MiCamp Taupo from Monday



20th March - 22th March. Having camp during term 1 is great because it gives us the opportunity to build a sense of whanaungatanga and strengthening our hub culture. As well as this it provides rich learning opportunities in a different setting across a range of curriculum areas. A health and safety permission form will been sent out this week. If you could please return it asap that would be greatly appreciated. Camp is heavily subsidised and

supported by the Board of Trustees and through fundraising. This means we have been able to lower the cost to \$220. Payments can be made to the office and includes the option of setting up a payment plan.

<u>Stationery</u> - Thank you again to our BOT who have covered the cost of stationery this year. Having all students set up to go from day 1 has been fantastic! We do use a communication book in our hub to help with keeping in contact about the different happenings in our hub. These are \$10 and can be paid for at the office.

<u>Communication</u> - We do our best to keep you informed and updated about things happening with your tamariki.
